CHAPTER 1 THE CRASH ON THE BEACH

This is a traveller's worst nightmare. Our flight from Sydney to Los Angeles has crashed on an island somewhere in the south Pacific. Amazingly, more than forty of us have survived. We are lucky to be alive.

But luck is far from our thoughts at the moment. We are all too frightened. I hear people scream. I watch them run from the burning plane while others stand in disbelief. I see bodies covered in blood, lying on the beach. Behind them, smoke rises from the crashed plane. On one of its broken wings, a motor is still turning. A man is walking in front of it. Seconds later, there's an explosion. Both the man and the motor disappear in a ball of fire.
