Circle time and thinking activities

These questions will get the children thinking and talking about keeping safe. Ensure, before beginning the discussion, that the children understand what the phrase 'keeping safe' means.

- What does 'keeping safe' mean? What safe places can you think of? What is your favourite safe place? Why is it a safe place? Do you try to keep other people safe?
- How do you keep safe on the roads? Do you know how to cross the road safely? How do you keep safe on your bike? Where do you ride? What do you wear to keep safe?
- 7 Have you ever felt unsafe at school? Have you ever been bullied? What happened? What did you do? Who did you tell? How did they help you?

- How do you keep safe at home? What things at home might be dangerous to you? Do you try to keep other people safe at home?
- How do you keep safe at school? Can you think of a school rule that helps to keep you safe?
- How many of you go away on holiday?
 Where have you visited on holiday?
 Was it a safe or an unsafe place? How could you tell? Have you ever got into danger on holiday?
 What happened?
