One	More than one	Usual rule
<p>one cat</p> 	<p>two cats</p> 	<p>most words: add 's'</p>
<p>one bus</p> 	<p>two buses</p> 	<p>words which end in 's', 'sh', 'tch' or 'x': add 'es'</p>
<p>one brush</p> 	<p>two brushes</p> 	
<p>one watch</p> 	<p>two watches</p> 	
<p>one fairy</p> 	<p>two fairies</p> 	<p>words which end in 'y' after a consonant: remove 'y' and add 'ies'</p>

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
