

LETTER OF COMPLAINT

Imagine you are Freddy and you have found the camera in the Doc Marten boots. You are going to write a letter of complaint to the company.

Things to include:

- 1. Write in Freddy's point of view put yourself in Freddy's shoes!
- 2. Think about <u>how</u> he would find the camera in the shoes, <u>what</u> he thinks when he finds it, and suggest some improvements to the shoe company. Freddy might complain about things such as:
 - The boots were uncomfortable
 - Electronic devices are not allowed in school so the boots got confiscated
 - The camera takes bad photos
 - Lamont's boots did not have a camera in them
- 3. Freddy should be writing to complain but also to suggest improvements, such as:
 - Asking for them to be made more comfortable
 - Not putting a camera in the boots
 - Making sure there is consistency (cameras in every boot)

TOP TIPS!

Think about the character of Freddy and his traits. He is completely oblivious to everything going on and always tries his best. Freddy would write his letter to help the shoe company and would have their best interests at heart

Remember:

- If Freddy feels he has shown his feelings too much, he often crosses out the most personal parts of his writing.
- Freddy likes using these kind of words: GUTTED, LAME, SOOOOO, YUCK! ACE, DEAD UPSET, AMAZING, DISGUSTING.
- Freddy also likes using interesting similes, such as: 'like two slugs dancing on his forehead' and 'like a flower shop has thrown up on her' – try to include a simile in your letter.

NEWSPAPER ARTICLE

Newspaper articles try to achieve two main things:

- 1. Giving people facts about what has happened
- 2. Trying to let readers know why what happened is important

So, when writing a newspaper article, remember to include plenty of facts (WHAT happened, WHERE the event took place, WHO was involved, HOW it happened).

After you've covered that, try to write a couple of sentences about WHY the event happened and WHY it is important (why should the readers be interested in this event?).

And don't forget these common newspaper elements:

- An attention-grabbing headline
- A subheading to give a bit more information that encourages readers to read on
- Write in the third person (he/she/them/they) and write everything with confidence!
- Include quotes from witnesses (Think about what someone might say if they'd seen the event you were describing – this is the quote you can use).
- An interesting picture to illustrate the article

Who buys chocolate milk – does your packaging appeal to your target audience?


Extra Challenge:

MAKE CHOCOLATE MILK

Adult supervision required

Make your own chocolate milk following the recipe and create your own branded packaging to wrap around your cup.

Recipe:	Ingredients:	Extras!
Prep: 10 minutes Shake: 1 minutes Serves: 1	Chocolate spread Milk Chocolate ice cream Double cream	Whipped cream Marshmallows Chocolate sauce

Method:

- 1. Melt your ice cream for a few seconds in the microwave to make it runny
- 2. Pour the melted ice cream into a blender with a spoonful of chocolate spread
- 3. Add a little bit of cream
- 4. Whizz up until blended

To serve:

Drizzle chocolate sauce or chocolate inside your cup to line it with some extra chocolate

Pour in your chocolate milk

Top with any extras of your choice

If this chocolate milk drink is too sickly-sweet for you, why not try finding a delicious sprout recipe to make up instead!
